#### Used Clothing To Help Veterans

You can do some Spring cleaning (no matter the season) and, at the same time, help a needy veteran. Post 7 has entered into an agreement with Turnkey Enterprises to place a shed on post property for storing used clothing and other items.

The donations are sold to second hand outlets in the Mid-Atlantic states. Turnkey will pay the Post based on the weight of the contributed goods. Funds provided by the company will be dedicated to a fund for aiding veterans and their families suffering financial difficulty. In the past the Post has drawn monies from its operations budget to meet requests.

Items accepted include all clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, pillowcases, drapes and stuffed toys. All donated items should be placed in plastic bags. Turnkey Enterprises ask that rags, scraps, toys (other than stuffed animals), and household goods NOT be donated. A for-profit company, Turnkey Enterprises LLC based in New Jersey, partners with nonprofit organizations like The American Legion in communities to aid their fundraising initiatives by recycling unwanted clothing. The items collected are used as clothing and not cut into rags. The storage shed is on the southwest end of the parking lot.

A Centennial Gift from Our Favorite Artist By Jocelyn Bartone

What do you get when you cross the 100th anniversary of the American Legion (and Post 7) with a wonderfully generous artist who has a little unexpected free time on his hands? You get a single soldier standing by a grave among the brilliant red poppies in Flanders Fields. You get a beautiful and moving reminder of the tragic events which led to the creation of the American Legion in 1919. In honor of our Centennial, Legion family member, Don Eick (SAL), created his third mural for our Lounge. His work pays tribute to both the Legion's history and to the Auxiliary which has made the mission of remembrance their own. At the end of WWI, while awaiting return to the U.S., Lieutenant Colonel Theodore Roosevelt Jr. suggested a group of men convene a caucus in Paris to establish a patriotic group to give them a sense of community and purpose. Eventually, when the troops returned home, the American Legion was fully established one of the key missions of which was to preserve the memories and incidents of their association in the Great War.

With his 1915 poem, "In Flanders Fields", Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae painted a vision of the poppies that thrived on the graves of thousands in Europe. In time, through the concerted efforts of Moina Michael, the poppy became the internationally accepted symbol of remembrance of the human cost of war. She wrote a poem in response to McCrae's and promised to always wear a poppy as she kept the faith. She then began making them for



distribution. In the 1920's the Legion adopted the poppy as its official flower and gave the Auxiliary the mission of distributing paper poppies with the goal of honoring and fundraising on Memorial Day each year. So, for those who come to the Post, Don's poignant mural reminds us as we celebrate life and nourish our bodies, we must also nourish our hearts and souls and renew our dedication to service to our communities and our fellow veterans in the name of those who gave their lives in service to their country.

Additionally, in recognition of the Centennial, the Auxiliary is creating a special commemorative wreath that will hang high up in the front vestibule. It is made of the fabric from a modern day BDU (Battle Dress Uniform) representing the essence of the Auxiliary's historic mission. Always and foremost, we stand in support of our uniformed military personnel, past, present and future. We support them as they serve, and when their active duty service is done. The wreath is wrapped with a vintage patriotic ribbon representing our one hundred years of history. Resting at the bottom of the wreath are two large poppies remininding us of our fundamental promise to never forget the service and sacrifice of those who died in the service of their country, then, now and always. So, in honor of those who came before and those who will follow, we stand together and work not only to support our troops and veterans, but also in support of the families and communities that make up the fabric of America, because therein lies the future of our military and our country. Happy Anniversary!
